



## Allan Mitchell Dolasinski

Allan Dolasinski, of Carmen, was cremated at his request with no services. Cremation arrangements are under the direction of Wentworth Mortuary, LLC.

Allan Mitchell Dolasinski, son of the late Zenon M. Dolasinski and Anna Mae (Thatcher) Ward, was born September 30, 1949, at Gary, Indiana, and passed away May 10, 2023, at his home in Carmen, at the age of 73 years, 7 months, and 10 days.

Allan was raised in Indiana and graduated High School there. He was drafted into the United States Army during the Vietnam War and received a Purple Heart for his service. After being discharged, he met Harriet Springman while they both were working in the Steel Mill in Indiana where he operated cranes and she worked making plates and shears. They were married in common law until 1981 when they married officially in Canadian County, Oklahoma.

They lived in and out of Oklahoma where they worked and also in several other states for the Government. He was a heavy duty machine operator building roads in Colorado, Montana, and Wyoming. They lived on Lake Meade, Nevada, where he was a dock worker in sales and mechanics. He also installed alarm systems in Las Vegas. He and Harriet have traveled to every state in the United States, visiting all National Parks. They moved to Missouri in 1987 where he ran a contract Post Office and Gift Shop before

coming back to Oklahoma in 1990 to stay. He worked in the oil field before becoming an over the road truck driver till his retirement a few years ago.

Besides his father, Zenon, and his mother, Anna Mae, he was preceded in death by a sister, Toni Best.

Allan is survived by his wife, Harriet Dolasinski, of Carmen; his brothers, Gary Dolasinski and wife, Vicki, of Carmen, and Mark Dolasinski of Enid; other relatives and friends.
