Barbara Hope Reichenberger, daughter of the late Ora and Myrtle (Moad) Adams, was born March 30, 1929, in Sun City, Kansas, and died peacefully surrounded by her three boys March 16, 2015, in Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 85 years, 11 months, and 16 days.

Barbara graduated from Sun City High School with the Class of 1947. She married her high school sweetheart, Cletus George Reichenberger on June 23, 1951, at the United States Navel Base in San Diego, California. They remained married for over 50 years.
