Charles Edward Whipple, son of the late Merton Elmer and Dorothy M. (Cook) Whipple, was born April 22, 1933, at Pond Creek, Oklahoma, and passed away March 22, 2005, at the age of 71 years and 11 months. Charles was cremated at his request.

Charles graduated from Waynoka High School. He served in Korea while he was in the United States Army. He then worked as a stuntman in Hollywood for several of the western series on television, including *Rawhide*, *Bonanza* and as a double for Doc Adams in *Gunsmoke*. He then worked for the Santa Fe Railroad and ran a motel in Liberal, Kansas for a time. He was known as a *Jack-of-all-trades*.

Charles attended the Waynoka Church of God. He was a member of the American Legion, wrote poetry, painted and loved music.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by one son, Chuck; two brothers, Lee and George.
