Danny Homer Strohmeyer, son of Homer Zachariah and Juanita Bessie (Wilson) Strohmeyer, was born April 15, 1940, at Waynoka and passed away September 18, 2025, at Alva at the age of 85 years, 5 months, and 3 days.

Danny attended school in Waynoka. He joined the United States Army in 1957, proudly serving his country until his retirement in 1977. During his service, he was stationed overseas in both Germany and Korea. He served two combat tours in Viet Nam and was awarded a bronze star for his outstanding service. He was stationed at many bases throughout the country, including one of their favorites, Alaska. On May 21, 1960, he was united in marriage to Linda Kay "Katy" Nutter at Alva. To this union they had three children: Michael, Niki, and DaNae. After his retirement from the military, they made their home north of Waynoka where they raised their family.
