



## Eddie Stanley Lyon

Eddie Stanley Lyon, son of the late Vern Stanley and Mildred (Austin) Lyon, was born February 20, 1930, on the farm south of Avard, and passed away December 20, 2007, at the Waynoka Nursing Center at the age of 77 years and 10 months.

After Eddie graduated from Avard High School, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, serving from 1950 to 1953. He became a Journeyman meat cutter at King Soopers in Denver where he was eventually promoted to supervisor. After his retirement in 1981 he moved to Waynoka.

In his younger years, he enjoyed playing baseball. He loved hunting, fishing, and visiting with family and friends. He also enjoyed gardening and sharing his fruit and vegetables.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by three brothers, Coy Lyon, Clifford Lyon, and Grover Lyon; one daughter, Dona Lowe; and one granddaughter, Colbie May Crandall.

I remember feeling alone too much and misguided. I am the youngest of his children and by that time (fourteen or so) I felt out of place and long left behind. I place no blame. When I was young then my life&s path led me away. It led me to many other paths and some of those paths to far off distant places. I&m sorry Dad I didn&t find my way back to you sooner. I guess I thought I&d be back someday. Someday was too long and too late. The last half of his life he was in his childhood land and liked it best. I sincerely Thank all of You for knowing, loving, helping and being with my dad in the last years and days of his life. I&m sure it brought him comfort and happiness. For it is you he gave his best.
