Funeral services for Edith Jones will be 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, July 31, 2024, at the Aline United Methodist Church with Pastor Carmen Stafford and Ryan Pullan officiating. Burial will follow in the Aline Star Cemetery under the direction of Wentworth Mortuary, LLC.

Edith Viola, daughter of the late Frank Dean and Cora Mae (Meliza) Weber, was born August 25, 1930, on the farm of her grandad's homestead near McWillie, Oklahoma, and passed away July 25, 2024, at Fairview at the age of 93 years and 11 months.

Edith attended grade school at McWillie and graduated from Helena High School in 1948. On July 22, 1950, she was united in marriage to Curtis Junior Jones. They made their home in the Aline area where they farmed all of their married life. Curtis passed away on June 16, 1993.

She was a member of the Aline United Methodist Church where she served on many different committees and also as a Sunday School teacher. She served as a Cub Scout Den Mother, a substitute teacher, and as the judge on the Aline election boards. Edith also served on the Alfalfa Electric Roundup Committee for 11 years.

Edith was a true example of what a Christian should be. If a family member,

neighbor, or friend needed anything, she would be right there without any expectation of something in return. She would always put the needs and interests of others first. Edith had the selfless, love that characterizes God Himself. Edith's positive, encouraging words will be missed by many.

Besides her parents, Frank and Mae, she was preceded in death by her husband, Junior; and her brother, Frank Dean Weber.

She is survived by many nieces, nephews, other relatives and many friends.
