Fern Smiley, daughter of the late Alven and Alice (Linville) Edwards, was born June 12, 1919, at Cheyenne Valley, Oklahoma, and passed away September 24, 2009, at Waynoka, Oklahoma, at the age of 90 years, 3 months, and 12 days.

After graduating from Cheyenne Valley High School, Fern attended Northwestern Oklahoma State University. On April 15, 1940, she was united in marriage to Don Russell Smiley at Ringwood. They lived their entire life in Waynoka.

Fern worked at Frank's Department Store for about 20 years and also at Converse's Grocery.

She was an active member of the Waynoka First Baptist Church where she taught Sunday School.
