Florence Behm Wise Nickel, daughter of the late Charley and Beulah (Beecher) Behm, was born December 29, 1912, on a farm near Carmen, Oklahoma, and passed away March 2, 2009, at Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 96 years, 2 months, and 4 days.

Florence attended Bellview Country School and graduated from Carmen High School. She then graduated from Northwestern State Teachers College in Alva and attended Phillips University in Enid, completing her education. Her teaching career began in 1932, retiring from Adams Grade School in Enid in 1977. After her retirement she lived in Carmen. In 1984, she was united in marriage to Bennie Nickel.

She touched and influenced many young lives throughout her teaching career. Her greatest joys were the many successes of her former students through letters, visits, and telephone calls.

Florence is survived by her husband, Bennie, her daughter, Mary Inez Hoffman and her husband, Neal, of Carmen; her grandson, Brian Hoffman and wife, Martha, of Bullard, Texas; two sisters, Audrey Presnall and Lois Kassik, both of Alva; and one niece, Nancy Presnall of Enid; other relatives and many friends.
