Garland Eugene Quarles, son of William Richard and Rachel (Smith) Quarles, was born May 20, 1925, in Red River County, Texas, and passed away July 19, 2010, at Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 85 years, 1 month, and 29 days. After Garland graduated from Clarksville High School in Clarksville, Texas, he attended Paris Jr. College in Paris, Texas. He served in the United States Navy from 1943 to 1946. On November 17, 1962, he was united in marriage to Wilma Alice Roach in Grants, New Mexico. He worked as a manager at Levines which sold clothing and general merchandise. He worked for the company for 40 years until he retired in 1988. He moved to Waynoka shortly thereafter.

He was a member of the First Baptist Church. He was also a member of Waynoka Masonic Lodge #422 where he served as a Past Master. He enjoyed remodeling houses.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Wilma, on July 5, 2010; two step sons, Johnny Quarles and Billy Quarles; one sister, Thelma Bryson; and two brothers, Thurman Quarles, and Billy Quarles.
