Gerald Lee Jaquith, son of the late William Edward and Ela Elda (Barns) Jaquith, was born January 29, 1941, at the farm in Major County, Oklahoma, and passed away, July 27, 2019, at the age of 78 years, 5 months, and 26 days.

Gerald graduated Waynoka High School with the Class of 1959. He graduated from NWOSU with a Mathematics Education Degree and furthered his education at SWOSU. He taught math at Shattuck and Higgins Texas, then Albuquerque, New Mexico for many years. He returned to Oklahoma in 1984 and taught at Ringwood. He moved back to the Waynoka area in the late 1980's.
