April 14, 1917 - March 8, 2010

Funeral services for Glenda Curry will be 10:00 a.m. Saturday, March 13, 2010, at the Helena Church of Christ with Lindal Bolin officiating. Interment will follow in the Carmen City Cemetery under the direction of Wentworth Mortuary, LLC, of Carmen. Glenda Maxine (Camp) Curry, daughter of the late Homer James and Ada (Kisner) Camp, was born April 14, 1917, at Waynoka, Oklahoma, and passed away March 8, 2010, at Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 92 years, 10 months, and 22 days. Glenda attended Twin Oaks Grade School and later attended Waynoka High School. On September 12, 1936, she was united in marriage to Ira Leroy Curry at Alva, Oklahoma. To this union five children were born: Harvey, Garry, James, Linda, and Irala. They made their home at Galena before moving to the Carmen area in 1949. Glenda has lived the past five years at Beadles Nursing Home in Alva, Oklahoma. She was a member of the Helena Church of Christ.
