Jimmie Lee Pittman, son of the late Bobby Lee and Geraldine Maxine (Brown) Pittman, was born November 24, 1947, in Alva, Oklahoma, and passed away May 22, 2009, in Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 61 years, 5 months, and 28 days.

Jimmie attended school in Alva through the 4th grade and graduated from high school in Independence, Missouri. He served in the United States Navy from 1968 to 1969.
