



## Kenneth "Kenny" Leo Meyer

May 17, 1947 - December 14, 2024

Kenneth Leo, son of the late Leo August and Jessie Beulah (Clark) Meyer, was born May 17, 1947, at Hardtner, Kansas, and passed away December 14, 2024, at Alva at the age of 77 years, 7 months, and 27 days.

Kenny was raised in the Alva area and attended Lambert Grade School and the Lutheran School. He later attended and graduated from Alva High School. In 1969, he was united in marriage to Lyn Irons at Alva. Together they had two children, Cris and Amy. He went to Oklahoma State University to obtain his teaching credentials and went on to instruct diesel mechanics at the Northwest Area Vo-Tech School from 1978-1987. He was the only diesel mechanic instructor that taught at the Alva campus. After his years teaching, he opened Meyer Electric Motor Service that he operated until his retirement.

He was a member of the Alva Moose Lodge and an Honorary Member of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol. He enjoyed fishing when he wasn't working. He also enjoyed antique tractor pulls and racing.

Besides his parents, Leo and Jessie, he was preceded in death by his brother,

John Meyer.

Kenny is survived by his children, Cris Meyer and wife, Brooke, of Alva, and Amy Crawford of Alva; six grandchildren, Kaitlyn, Kenadie, and Colt Meyer, all of Alva, Keiton Crawford and wife, J'Lynn, of Woodward, Kaleigh Crawford of Woodward, and Kole Crawford of Fairview; one great grandson, Kix Crawford; and his sister, Sharon Sebranek and husband, Larry, of Covington; many other relatives and friends.
