Cecil Lee Kragh, son of the late Cecil Theodore and Mable Edith (Wylie) Kragh, was born September 1, 1928, at Quinlan, Oklahoma, and passed away August 3, 2008, at the Waynoka Nursing Center in Waynoka, Oklahoma, at the age of 79 years, 11 months, and 2 days.

Lee attended school at Del Plain School before graduating from Waynoka High School with the Class of 1945. On November 7, 1948, he was united in marriage to Dorothy Mae Harris at Waynoka. He worked as a Deputy Sheriff for a time, then went to work as a Security Guard for Boeing Aircraft in Wichita. After his retirement from Boeing, they moved to Waynoka where he also ranched.

Cecil attended the Waynoka Church of God and was a member of the West Side Church of the Nazarene in Wichita. He and Dorothy loved to raise and care for miniature horses.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother, Karl Kragh.
