



Leonard James "Lennie" Haight

August 6, 1952 - January 29, 2021

Memorial services for Leonard James "Lennie" Haight will be 2:00 p.m. Saturday, February 6, 2021, at the Alva Church of God with Rev. Bob Brown and Pastor Nathan Braudrick officiating. Lennie was cremated at his request under the direction of Marshall Funeral Home of Alva.

Leonard James "Lennie" Haight, son of the late LeRoy James and Alta Marie (Stallings) Haight, was born August 6, 1952, in Alva, Oklahoma, and passed away January 29, 2021, in Enid, Oklahoma, at the age of 68 years, 5 months, and 23 days.

Lennie graduated from Alva High School with the Class of 1971, then attended Central Bible College in Springfield, Missouri. In 1974, he was united in marriage to Jill Mercer. He was a jewelry maker and joined the Alva Fire Department as a full time firefighter, retiring in 2005 after 30 years of service. On January 31, 1997, he was united in marriage to Anne Crusinbery in Memphis, Tennessee. He also owned and operated NW Fire and Safety for many years. After his retirement from the fire department he became a fire safety instructor.

Lennie was a member of the Alva Church of God and ACTE. He reorganized the Alva retired fighter group. He enjoyed fishing, bowling, and umpiring softball and baseball.

Lennie is survived by his wife, Anne Haight, of Alva, five sons, Jeremy Haight and wife, Stephanie, of Sapulpa; Jimmy Haight and wife, Ameer, of Alva; Jarrod Haight and wife, Shandi, of Stillwater, Kyle Stauffer of Jacksonville, Florida, and Kelly Stauffer and wife, Amanda, of Aline; one brother, Larry Haight and wife, Rebecca, of Redding, California; and his stepmother, Edith Haight.

Also surviving are 12 grandchildren, Taylor Haight, Tara Haight, and Tabitha Schultz all of Muskogee, Austin Haight of Ringwood, Charles Shafer of Alva, Serena Haight, Jacob Haight, both of Sapulpa, Ainsley Haight, Addisyn Haight, and Abel Haight, all of Stillwater, and Hunter and Aspen Stauffer, both of Aline; two great grandchildren, Corbin and Jaxson Brown, both of Muskogee; other relatives and many friends.

I am now 68 and had been wondering whatever has happened to Lennie. I have observed this phenomenon before to find the person had passed away. I have been fighting brain tumors for 20 years now and am doing well now have no complaints. I remember Lennies zest for life and his full board athletics to include a baseball game in which he was running the bases and ran into a light pull on the ball field. He laid his chin open and got a pretty plenty of stitches in his chin. He just laughed it off. Nick took him into the basement at the fire station to exercise and Lennie was experiencing pain, nuck kept pushing him and Lennie passed out from the pain and stopped breathing I got called on my radio to go to the basement. I really worried about Lennie after that. I was sure he must have some oddball rare disease where if he was in pain he passed out maybe a seizure disorder. A couple of years ago I saw a baby who had a rare 1 in a million disease that was diagnosed in the Netherlands and I wondered how Lennie was doing. I can't remember the name of the disease now but I am sure Lenny had the same illness. Lennie was a great man. who I will always have fond memories of. May he live side by side with his loved ones in heaven now and GOD BLESS hi. and his family please lighten their load now during this sad time of loss. I am sure he is in a better place now.
