Lillie Ann Morrison, daughter of the late Abraham and Carolyn (Bechtold) Bekker, was born November 22, 1924, at Okeene, Oklahoma, and passed away December 6, 2008, at Alva, Oklahoma, at the age of 84 years and 12 days. Lillie attended the Isabella School. In 1945, she was united in marriage to James Fredrick Morrison on the McGinley farm near Dacoma. They lived in Walnut Grove, California for 24 years before returning to Dacoma to make their home. After returning to Dacoma, she worked at Whittets for 37 years until her retirement in 2005. She was a member of the Dacoma Church of God. She was a Prayer Warrior and prayed for everyone in Dacoma every night. While living in California, she helped with the March of Dimes. She also enjoyed sewing and baby sitting.
