Lois Helen, daughter of the late Dennis Larue and Sarah Emma (Smalley) Hood, was born October 30, 1928, at Harper, Kansas, and passed away after a short illness February 7, 2025, at Alva, at the age of 96 years, 3 months, and 8 days.

Lois attended school and graduated from Kiowa High School. She received her Bachelor's Degree and later her Master's Degree in Reading from Central State University. She taught elementary school for many years. On August 31, 1948, she was united in marriage to Hartsell Alton Johnson at Kiowa, Kansas. They celebrated 72 years together until his passing in 2020.

After moving to Alva, she taught in the Capron and Alva Public schools. She is remembered by many of her former students. She was an integral part of the College Hill Church of Christ where her husband ministered for many years. She worked with the students and fed many kids through the Bible Chair. She loved to walk all over Alva and would walk to visit the sick, elderly, or needy. Lois had a Godly servant heart for those in need and often sent cards or

prepared food for them.

Besides her parents, Dennis and Sarah, she was preceded in death by her loving husband, Hartsell; and her brother, Delbert Hood.

She is survived by her son, Kyle Johnson of Azle, Texas; her daughter, Christy Crawford and husband, Dennis, of Moore; three grandchildren; six great grandchildren; and three great great grandchildren; other relatives and many friends.
