



## Marvin Earnest Melrose

January 24, 1922 - April 14, 2020

Marvin Earnest Melrose, son of the late Adam Lee and Esther (Galer) Melrose, was born January 24, 1922, at Carmen, Oklahoma, and passed away April 14, 2020, at Wichita, at the age of 98 years, 2 months, and 20 days.

He grew up in Carmen and graduated high school there. On February 23, 1947, he was united in marriage to Ruth Maxine Harmon. Early in their marriage they lived in Carmen, running the Goodyear Store, before making their home in Wichita, Kansas, for the past 70+ years. Marvin was a scheduler and buyer for Lear Jet until his retirement. He enjoyed collecting John Deere tractors and accumulated quite a collection.

Besides his parents and step mother, Grace (Bruner) Melrose, he was preceded in death by his wife, Maxine; his son, Fredrick Joseph Melrose; his siblings, Eldon Melrose, LaVern Melrose, and Virginia Ryel; and step siblings, Oval Booze, Nadine Harvey, Jean Jack, and Joyce Krepel.
