Stephen William Hansen, son of the late Ernest (Dutch) and Marie (Leatherman) Hansen, was born at the Alva General Hospital on March 12, 1944, and passed away June 23, 2018, at St. Anthony's Hospital in Oklahoma City at the age of 74 years, 5 months, and 14 days.

Steve graduated from Alva High School and attended Northwestern State University before joining the Air Force.
