



## Wendall Clark

January 1, 1923 - July 2, 2011

Verne "Wendall" Clark, son of the late Verne and Elsie Faye (Aller) Clark, was born January 1, 1923 at Amorita, Oklahoma, and passed away July 2, 2011, at the age of 88 years, 6 months, and 1 day.

Wendall graduated from Amorita High School. On November 16, 1955, he was united in marriage to Loreta Fern Hess at Cherokee, Oklahoma. He worked with his dad at, and later owned Clark's Shop, where he worked as a blacksmith, repaired equipment and sold hardware which he owned and operated for 65 years. He also worked as a Rural Mail Carrier for 43 years, retiring in 1992.

Wendall was a member of the Amorita Community Church, Past President of the Northwest Fiddler's Association, Past President of ABBD Senior Citizens, and past member of the Oklahoma Rural Letter Carriers Association. He really enjoyed playing the fiddle, performing roadshows and magic acts, and teaching people to square dance.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Loreta.

Wendall is survived by one son, Verne Clark and wife, Marilyn, of Amorita; two daughters, Judy Junkins of Taloga, and Cynthia Rose and husband, David, of Taloga; five grandchildren, Keyra Clark, Lexi Clark, and Brenner Clark, all of
